



2 CORINTHIANS 3:2-5 NKJV - (2) "You are our epistle written in our hearts, known and read by all men; (3) clearly you are an epistle of Christ, ministered by us, written not with ink [spot or wrinkle], but by the Spirit of the living God; not in tables of stone, but on tables of flesh, that is, of the heart.
(4) And we have such trust through Christ toward God. (5) Not that we are sufficient of ourselves to think anything as of ourselves; our sufficiency is in God."

God has made His Church an epistle written on [the tablet] within the heart; that New - New Testament. By allowing the ministry of reconciliation to manifest itself in their hearts. As a wise Master Builder, God created the earth in seven days; but during the [intertestamental period], how long did it take man to compile the New Testament letters? It took over 400 years between the prophet Malachi and the birth of Christ to bring forth the Bible in [Hebrew/Greek, Aramaic, Latin and English], and since that time portions of it has been translated into thousands of languages, which may appear to have spot and wrinkle.

But that [New Testament] which God writes in a man's heart is without spot or wrinkle. The Word of God written from Genesis to Revelation in the Bible are not the only words used to convey His message; surely God can use scripture text and verse; as well as any means [He Wills] to convey the [Spirit] of His Word. Every man must be led by the Spirit unto all Truth; And there's no man who can stop [The Believer] from going forth in that Truth. God proves that which He has placed in the heart of His people, by way of the Holy Ghost.

The Word of the Lord is established, and in Heaven it is settled; who can change it? The fool has said in his heart, there is no God. So, what bearing has the fool on matters appertaining the Spirit? The fool can't change it. The Word of the Lord is settled in a Believer's Heart, and none can change it.
